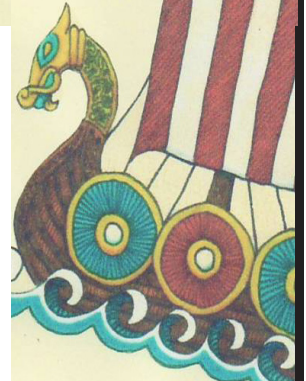
At my funeral, I ask all my friends to raise their glass and SKÅL to the good times we have had.

Meet our Members

Ann Sandner

Following Ann's name in the roster is "Speech Pathology." For thirty-two years Ann was the speech pathologist for El Dorado County School District. That is a lifetime of work developing effective communication skills for children with myriad problems in speech and or hearing.

For the past six years, this dedicated lady is still in demand and works part time for Folsom-Rancho Cordova School District.



Ann was born Ann Ulleberg in Thief River Falls MN. It was her grandfather who first emigrated here from Drammen, Norway in 1902. After he arrived he sent back word to a girlfriend, that things were good here. She followed him to MN bringing along her sister as a traveling companion. The inside family story is Grandfather Ulleberg married the companion.

Ann's mother was a teacher and her father an accountant. When Ann was six the family moved to Stockton CA because her father had contracted TB. Needing a milder climate he was able to transfer with his company,

While in Stockton she attended all grades including two years of college. After graduating she married John Stagnaro in 1957, moved to Sacramento, and had two children, Roger and Cindy.

Things were going well and Ann wanted to get her Masters Degree in Speech Pathology at Sacramento State College. The College of Education requires a physical examination for all enrollees. She was diagnosed with having TB and spent two years at Wiemar Sanitorium plus having a large part of one lung removed. Ann was only twenty-two years of age, and this was devastating to her and her young family. As if this wasn't enough trauma, her mother died just before her sanitorium stay and her father died just after.

Within a few years, she had another child, Steve. In 1966 her husband died just nine years after their marriage.

Ann never lost the desire to become a speech pathologist and by 1970 she had her Masters from Sacramento State. There is a drop-out rate of 50% for students in almost any speech pathology class. It is so demanding in learning the integration of all that goes into speaking and hearing. Ann has the intellect and drive to do anything she sets her mind to. After graduating, she immediately went to work for El Dorado County School District, worked there until 2003 when she retired.

In 1969 she married Richard Sandner and they had two more children, Keith and Shauna. Sandner was employed at Formica in Lincoln and just recently died in 2009.

The end result of helping children to communicate is so gratifying, but sometimes getting there is so tedious and takes a lot of patience, and determination. Imagine having a case load of sixty to seventy children a year. Using just half the number, in her career as speech pathologist, Ann has brought normal speech and personal confidence to over a thousand children. When she sees the parents today, they tell her how thankful they are because those kids are now doctors, pilots, lawyers and CEO's, etc.

Parents can be a problem too. When Ann would find a child with a speech problem some parents would be in denial. This added to the complexity of the work.

All work and no play could have made Ann a little tired of it all. She found her bliss in travel. In 1976 she and a fellow teacher traveled to Europe. After

this trip, Ann never looked back. She has been to Norway eleven times and has traveled to seventeen countries and all but eleven states. She just recently returned from Italy.

When Ann's daughter came back from Norway in 1985, she brought Ann a knitting pattern. It was all in Norwegian so Ann had to have it translated by S/N member Maren Hawke. This of course is what prompted Ann to join Roald Amundsen that same year. Being a dedicated and involved member, Ann became president in 1993-94 and again in 2004-05.

All of Ann's five children and seven grandchildren are doing well and Ann's walls are covered with pictures of family.

If there was a show today called "This Is Your Life Ann Sandner," they would have to have a very large auditorium to hold all of the children, that are now grown up, that Ann has helped to make whole, healthy and normal. Ann, you are such a worthwhile and loving person. Today we hear a lot about givers and takers. You are a giver to your family, your lodge, your community and to all those kids who today can shout, ANN, WE LOVE YOU!

Final days for 50-øre coin



Norway's Central Bank (Norges Bank) is taking the last of the coins that once made up a krone out of circulation as of 2012. The 50-øre coin (two of them makes one krone) is also probably the last of the copper coins to be minted in Norway.

The move marks the first time since the krone was divided up into 100 øre in 1875 that

Norwegians no longer can pay for goods and services with both "kroner and øre."

The bank board determined that too many Norwegians would receive 50-øre coins as change but then set them aside and not re-use them. That led to high costs of producing millions of the little copper coins every year, even though the bank estimates there are nearly 370 million 50-øre coins actually in circulation among the public.

Anyone sitting with a large supply of 50-øre coins need not despair; they can be traded in at the Central Bank for another 10 years.

NORSEMAN XTREME TRIATHLON

The Brutal Norseman

Call it gluttons for punishment, but 500 hardy souls from 37 countries took part in early August in what's been called one of the "most brutal" races in the world; the extreme triathlon known as the "Norseman".

The race involves swimming 3.8 kilometers in the ice chilly Hardangerfjord, followed by a 180 kilometer bike race from sea level at Eidfjord up the mountain to the plateau known as Hardangervidda. That involves an elevation climb of around 1,200 meters (nearly 4,000 feet). The last leg of the triathlon is a 42.2 kilometer running race with the finish line at an elevation of 1,883 meters to the peak of Gaustadtoppen for a total of 226 kilometers in a single day.

The organizers warn that there are no service stations during the bike leg; there is a risk of extreme weather conditions on the mountains. You will probably be very cold, hate the hills, sometimes you will feel lonely and experience being unusually emotional. Another warning; Do not enter the race unless you have read the Race Manual as this is harder than any other long-distance race in the world.
