ORION'S BELT—ALL LIKED THE SAME BOOK!

The Roald Amundsen Lodge book club recently met "in the flesh" rather than via Zoom. After some snacks and libation the members discussed their book of the month, Orion's Belt.

This novel, written in 1977 by Norwegian author Jon Michelet (1944-2018), chronicles the Arctic adventures of three resourceful Norwegian lads who take on most any employment, legal or otherwise, while sailing among the many Arctic islands. Life on their old ship, the Sandy Hook, is rather fun— until they cross paths with some Russians.

The historical period is that of the Cold War. Nevertheless, the action seems to be earily plausible in today's geopolitical climate.

After discussing the book the group watched the movie (1985) that was made based on the book. It differed some from the book but nonetheless was an exciting tale with much beautiful scenery. The film was considered to be Norway's first modern action film.


The book club could comfortably take on a few new members if anyone is interested.

Number 24 is a Norwegian war NUMBER 24 drama on Netflix about a young man who resists Nazi Germany

during World War II. The film is based on the true story of **Gunnar Sønsteby** (1918 –2012), a Norwegian war hero who led the Oslo Gang in sabotaging Nazi operations. We recommend reading about him on Wikipedia



and elsewhere. Also, at least two books have been written about him, available on Amazon and elsewhere. The editor has not reviewed Number 24 yet, but he will.

Good Scandinavian TV series on Netflix include Borgen and The Are Murders.

April 26-27, 2025

Classes are open to adults 18 years and older. Painters of all skill levels are welcome. Classes are limited to 21 students per class. Once class limits are met, a short waitlist will be established. Registration closes on April 12th.

SEMINAR COST: The cost of the seminar is \$150, which includes instruction, wood piece, paints and mediums for use during class, design packet, and 5 meals. If you have received confirmation, but find that you are unable to attend, please let me know as soon as possible so I can notify someone on the wait list. Full refunds will be made for cancellations received before April 5th -- no refunds will be made after that date.

TEACHERS: Our teachers are Onya Tolmasoff and Sue Regadanz.

MEALS: Saturday breakfast, lunch, and dinner; Sunday breakfast and lunch; coffee/tea during breaks. Melanie and Patrick Souza will again do our cooking. Family members who are not painting can pay \$70 for meals.

COOKIES: During the coffee/tea breaks, cookies and other refreshments are provided by the participants in the specified class (to be noted on your confirmation). Each participant is asked to bring one dozen cookies or the equivalent of other refreshments to share.

ROOMS: Lodging is not included in the registration fee. Please make your bed reservation at the time you register (see Registration Form). You will pay for your lodging when you arrive at Camp. Current Sons of Norway members pay \$27.00 per night; non-members pay \$37.80 per night (both include an 8% Placer County Occupancy Tax). We are obligated for both Friday and Saturday nights, so each person will pay a total of \$54.00 (SoN member) or \$75.60 (non-member). Since there are a limited number of beds available, RVs and tents are encouraged. For RVs, members pay \$30 per night, non-members pay \$40 per night. RV spots have electrical and water, but no sewer hookups. For tents, members pay \$20 per night, nonmembers pay \$25 per night (limit or 4 per tent/RV). Again, the obligation is for two nights (\$60 or \$80/RV; \$40 or \$50/tent). There is no occupancy tax on RVs or tents. Pets are \$2 per night. Learn more about Camp Norge lodging on the camp web site.


