


#### **NORWEGIAN ARTIFACTS—REALLY BIG SALE! P. 2**

#### FINLAND, RUSSIA AND NORWAY SHARE BORDERS

Now that Finland is a part of NATO, the country has armed border guards on skis patrolling their common 830-mile border with Russia. They are also employing helicopters and drones along newly constructed 13-foot high fences along this border — the longest border NATO nations now have with Russia.

The Finns reportedly feel the Russians have been provocative in several ways, including pushing waves of immigrants toward Finland in an effort to destabilize the country.

It should be noted that Norway's much shorter (122 miles\*) border with Russia is simply an extension of the Russian / Finnish border, and Russian maneuvers are of concern to Norway as well.

In a perhaps related matter, a new Russian port facility is being

constructed in Murmansk, Russia, a mere 145 miles from Kirkenes, the largest Norwegian town in the area. The project is being financed by Bulgaria. The facility should be operating by 2028 and is expected to handle 25-30 million tons of cargo annually.

Russia, in general, expects to be much more active in this far north area in the coming years. (Info from articles in the Wall Street Journal. Your editor will email copies to any member who requests them via email.)
